Six PhD Research Fellowships at the Department of Archaeology, History, Cultural Studies and Religion

At the Department of Archaeology, History, Cultural Studies and Religion there are six PhD fellowships available from 1 August 2015.

Qualification requirements

Applicants must meet the formal requirements for admission to the PhD programme at the University of Bergen. The University requires the equivalent of a master's degree (i.e. 3 years bachelor and 2 years master, 300 ECTS altogether). Applicants must have completed their master's degree at the time of application.

Applications may be in any of the department's subject areas:

- Archaeology
- History
- · Cultural Studies (Ethnology/Folklore)
- Religion

The project proposal should fall within one of the four subject areas and will be considered with reference to existing research milieus and available competence within the department. The candidate's main supervisor will normally come from the permanent academic staff of the department. The proposed supervisor must have confirmed his or her willingness to supervise the project, and the name of the supervisor must be stated in the application.

Salary

Salary will be in accordance with level 50 (code 1017/20.8) on the Norwegian government salary scale, currently NOK 429.700 - gross p.a. following ordinary meriting regulations.

A compulsory 2% contribution to the State Pension Fund (Statens pensionskasse) will be deducted from gross salary.

About the positions

The research fellow must take part in the University's approved PhD program. The fellowships' main goal is to lead to a PhD degree, which qualifies for independent research activities, and for other work that requires particular qualifications.

The fellowships are awarded for a period of four years, provided progress is satisfactory. The research and educational part of the fellowships is 75%, while the last 25% is allocated to teaching and other obligations. An agreement concerning the actual work load must be made with the department at the time of employment.

The successful applicants will be expected to relocate to the University of Bergen and conform to the regulations that apply to the positions.
