PhD position in Neuroscience

Job description

A PhD position in Neuroscience is available in the group of Associate Professor Koen Vervaeke: <http://vervaeke-lab.org/>. The lab is located at the Division of Physiology, Institute of Basic Medical Sciences (IMB), at the University of Oslo. The project is funded by the National Research Council. The position is initially for a period of 3 years and available from June 1, 2019.

More about the position

We are searching for highly motivated candidates with a strong interest in cortical circuits. We aim at determining cortical circuit functions in awake behaving animals using optical and electrophysiological methods. The position is funded by the National Research Council to study the role of specific neuron types in the cortex, and their roles in behavioral state-dependent processing and memory consolidation. The candidate will use in-vivo two-photon imaging and electrophysiology techniques to record neuronal activity, and optogenetic perturbations to identify cell-specific contributions to facilitating the dialogue between the cortex and hippocampus.

The main purpose of the fellowship is research training leading to the successful completion of a PhD degree.

Qualification requirements

- The applicants must have experience with at least one of the following disciplines; in vivo electrophysiology, in vivo two-photon microscopy, optogenetics, animal behavior or computational neuroscience.
- The candidates should be handy and be comfortable working with rodents.
- The applicant must also possess a familiarity with data analysis in MATLAB.
- The candidate should be able to work independently and structured, while at the same time engage in close collaborations with a multidisciplinary team.
- Team-working abilities and personal skills are highly valued.
- In assessing the applications, special emphasis will be placed on the relevance of the candidate's background.
- An excellent command of English is required.
