An 80% position as biostatistician (researcher) is available in the Clinical Effectiveness Research group, [Institute of Health and Society](#), University of Oslo, and Oslo University Hospital (OUS), Norway. The position is at Department of Health Management and Health Economics at the Institute of Health and Society, University of Oslo.

The position is available from September 1 2020 to December 31 2021, with an opportunity for extension.

We will include the statistician in ongoing and future research projects that are conducted by the research environment, including planning of new studies, data collection, data analyses and publication.
