About the position

One postion as Senior Adviser is available at the DHIS2 project at the Department of Informatics. The positions are permanent contagent upon external funding.

District Health Information Software 2 (<u>DHIS2</u>) is an open source, web-based health management information system (HMIS) platform. Today, DHIS2 is the world's largest HMIS platform, used by ministries of health in 70 countries. The core DHIS2 software development is managed by the <u>Health Information Systems Program (HISP) at the University of Oslo (UiO)</u>.

Currently, HISP is leveraging its global footprint and network of partners to provide DHIS2 as a management information systems platform also for the education sector. This is in line with our vision to provide a digital global good that can address management information system needs in the public sector in low- and middle-income countries. We work directly with global donors, ministries of education and Non-governmental organizations (NGOs). This work includes creating standardized configurations of DHIS2 based on state of the art education sector guidelines, indicators, decision support tools, etc.

Job description

Project managers work closely implementing partners in the countries where the DHIS2 is used as an Education Management Information System (EMIS). These countries are Uganda, Gambia, Mozambique and Togo. Furthermore, project managers are responsible for a portfolio of work that includes coordination with global partners such as UNESCO UIS, UNICEF and Save the Children, as well as supporting country education ministries in their adoption and implementation of DHIS2. Key activities associated with the available position includes coordination with international partners, in-country HISP partners, ministries of education, and overseeing the creation and maintenance of DHIS2 for EMIS global resources, including the development of guidance materials; implementation guidance, documentation; training curricula, etc.

Specific responsibilities include:

- Coordinate with global partners (e.g. UNESCO UIS, Norad, UNICEF, Save the Children; etc.) to define needs, resource requests and collaboration strategies;
- Ensure the completion of deliverables and contract requirements;
- Determine priorities related to the development of guidelines, translations, toolkits, and training curricula.
- Develop routines for coordination and alignment of implementation priorities with country needs and partner requests;
- Coordinate implementation resources, including technical and education specialist leads, to ensure timely and quality completion of projects;
- Provide specific budget and performance tasks related to DHIS2 projects;
- Promote open data, open standards, open source software, and open innovation and sharing.

Qualification requirements

This position requires:

- Five years+ experience of project management in digital and global projects, preferably in the education sector.
- Experience in working with international donor community, including bilateral and multilateral donor agencies and private foundations.
- Demonstrated experience leading information systems implementations in low- and middle-income countries.
- Experience managing teams, preferably also virtual teams.
- Demonstrated success in developing partnerships and funding opportunities.
- A Master's degree in a relevant field such as information systems, education or international development (MPH, MSc, etc.), or
 equivalent experience.
- Excellent communication skills and fluent command of English, both oral and written. Other languages are a plus.
- Structured, responsive and with excellent organizational skills.
- · Ability and willingness to travel internationally.
- Prior experience with HISP and DHIS2 is an advantage.
- · Eligible for employment in Norway.

- Enthusiasm for international development efforts and ability to work well both independently and within a team, at national and international level
- · Commitment to project management, coordination, documentation and relations building
