PhD position

There is a vacancy for two PhD position at the Department of Clinical Psychology, Faculty of Psychology, University of Bergen. The positions is for a fixed-term period of 4 years and funded by the University of Bergen.

About the project/work tasks:

The department will use the PhD positions to strengthen the ongoing research fields at the department. The main supervisor needs to be an employee at The Department of Clinical Psychology.

The Department of Clinical Psychology has 2 research groups and most of our employees are linked to one of these groups.

The PhD candidate's research project must be developed and conducted in consultation with the supervisor(s) at the DepartmentIf you want to apply for the position, you must contact a potential supervisor or research group and develop a project description. Link to template for project description can be found https://example.com/here.

The appointment as PhD candidate will be made on the basis of previous education and former scientific work, as well as quality and relevance of idea and plans for the research projects. The research project that the candidate is applying for will usually be further developed in consultation with the relevant research group and supervisor. The project must qualify the candidate for admission to the PhD programme at the Faculty of Psychology. When appointed the candidate will be given admission to the PhD programme at the Faculty of Psychology.

Qualifications and personal qualities:

- The applicant must at the time of application either hold a master's degree or the equivalent in Psychology
- For admission to the doctoral programme, grade B or above is normally required for the master's thesis
- Work independently and in a structured manner and have the ability to cooperate with others.
- Teaching experience is an advantage.
- Proficiency in both written and oral English
- Personal qualities will be emphasized. Ambitions and potential will also count when evaluating the candidates.

About the PhD position (applies to university PhD positions):

The duration of the PhD position is 4 years, of which 25 per cent of the time each year comprises required duties associated with research, teaching and dissemination of results. The employment period may be reduced if you have previously been employed in a recruitment position.

About the research training:

As a PhD Candidate, you must participate in an approved educational programme for a PhD degree for a period of 3 years. When your qualifications for the position are evaluated you will also be evaluated for admission to the PhD programme at the Faculty of Psychology.

- The names and contact information for two reference persons. One of these must be the main supervisor for the master's thesis or equivalent thesis.

- Transcripts and diplomas (higher education)
- Applicants with foreign education must enclose certified translations to English or Scandinavian if the original Diploma and grade
 transcripts are not already in one of these languages. The applicants must also enclose a confirmation from NOKUT that the education
 is recognized to be in accordance with the Norwegian master's degree. The review from NOKUT may take some time and the
 application should be sent to NOKUT as soon as you have decided to apply for the position. If no answer within the application deadline,
 please enclose documentation from NOKUT that they have received your application. Some qualifications from the Nordic countries are
 automatically recognized, please check NOKUT.

- Any publications in your name you want to be included in the evaluation of your application

Please note that applications, along with the information and attachments linked to the application in JobbNorge, will be evaluated after the closing date for applications.
