Field archaeologists 2022

About the position

The University of Stavanger invites applicants for field archaeologists to the Museum of Archaeology, Department of Cultural Heritage for the season 2022. As a field archaeologist at UiS you will get the opportunity to excavate archaeological sites in a region known for its rich cultural heritage. Findings from archaeological excavations are used as a basis for the museum's archaeological research and dissemination.

The work involves archaeological excavation and documentation in various parts of county Rogaland on various types of projects from all periods (for example Stone Age settlements, settlements from Bronze- and Iron Age, as well as grave sites). The daily place of work is the fieldwork site.

Our museum strives to offer long coherent contracts. This may result in the field archaeologists working on more than one project during the season and in different parts of County Rogaland. Some flexibility and mobility is thus required. In 2022, a large part of the museum's excavations will be related to road projects, including the new E39 between Kristiansand and Stavanger, where it must be expected to live outside the Stavanger region. Tasks associated with the E39 project will include both excavation and registration. The positions are externally funded.

We are making approximately 5-10 field employments, depending on the number and scope of the projects for the season, this will be clarified during the process. Applications are considered on an ongoing basis and the first assessment and employment will take place after **15.02.2022**. The final application deadline is 01.05.2022. The list of applicants may also be used if it is relevant to make further employments during the season.

Main tasks

- Archaeological excavation, documentation and survey
- Sampling and find collection
- Digital documentation, measurement and data processing in Intrasis

Qualification requirements

The person hired must have a higher education in archeology with relevance to Norwegian archeology, preferably at master's level. Students of archeology may also be considered.

Furthermore, we will emphasize:

- previous experience from archaeological fieldwork, incl. excavation and surveys.
- experience with digital systems (GIS and archaeological field documentation system Intrasis)
- a driver's license class B (must be documented as an attachment to the application)
- being independent, efficient and structured
- good communication and collaboration skills, good oral and written presentation skills in Norwegian and English
- being proactive, result-oriented and taking responsibility for the implementation of good work processes
