About the position

The Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences (MH) has an opening for a 100% permanent position as a Research Adviser/Senior Research Adviser. The primary purpose of the position is to contribute to increasing the faculty's share of EU funding, with a focus on hands-on support in the pre-award phase. The position is affiliated with the Faculty Administration's Research Section, and the employee will report directly to the Head of section.

On a day-to-day basis, the employee will work closely with another EU Research Advisor and be a key member of the small but active Grants Office team. This is a dynamic role and you will have the opportunity to actively contribute to further development of the EU portfolio at the MH Faculty

Your immediate leader will be Head of Section

Duties of the position

- Pre-award support for Horizon Europe applications: assist in all stages of the application process, from identifying relevant calls, helping
 researchers to navigate the requirements of the call, reviewing applications (including advising on structuring and presenting content),
 liaising with internal and external partners involved with the application, completing online forms and any administrative supporting
 documentation required for the application
- Participate in MH's/Helse Midt Norge's Grants Office (which is embedded in the Faculty's Research Section), including contributing to
 the Grants Office course portfolio (for example, in grant writing or specific EU schemes), staying updated on and disseminating
 information on national and international calls for research funding, and as needed, providing support in the application phase for other
 international or national funding schemes
- Collaborate with the team's Financial Advisors to support the applications' budget development as well as NTNU's central staff working
 with EU and other EU advisers at NTNU
- · Assist with contractual preparations of funded Horizon Europe projects (Grant Preparation Phase and Consortium Agreement)
- Facilitate with post-award reporting of ERC and coordinated Horizon Europe projects
- · Assist faculty management in matters pertaining to research policy, in particular EU and external funding
- · Participate in developing processes and routines focusing on externally funded research activities

Required selection criteria

- Relevant higher education from university or college at bachelor's level. For position as Senior Research Advisor education at master's
 level is required. The educational requirement may be substituted by significant and relevant experience in the work tasks above.
- Relevant experience with applications for external research funding and/or leading/coordinating large externally funded research projects
- Excellent written and oral proficiency in English

Preferred selection criteria

- Experience in EU proposal preparation and/or project management
- Experience with the European Research Council, Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions, and Cluster Health calls
- Experience with and/or interest in medicine and health-related research
- PhD experience

- · Experience with teaching and/or preparing courses
- · Basic knowledge of Norwegian

Salary and conditions

The gross salary for the position depends on qualifications and experience. Adviser code 1434 is normally remunerated at gross from NOK 516 100 - 594 300 before tax per year. The gross salary for Senior Adviser code 1364 is normally remunerated at gross from 563 900 - 677 600 before tax per year. From the salary, 2 % is deducted as a contribution to the Norwegian Public Service Pension Fund.

The engagement is to be made in accordance with the regulations in force concerning State Employees and Civil Servants, and the acts relating to Control of the Export of Strategic Goods, Services and Technology. Candidates who by assessment of the application and attachment are seen to conflict with the criteria's in the latter law will be prohibited from recruitment to NTNU. After the appointment you must assume that there may be changes in the area of work.

It is a prerequisite you can be present at and accessible to the institution on a daily basis.
