PhD Research Fellow CLEG

Job description

Applicants are invited for a 4-year position as PhD Research Fellow in the area of Curriculum Studies and Didactics to be based at the Department of Education, University of Oslo.

Democracy, participation and sustainability are keywords that address global, national and local challenges. Public education is expected to play an active role in responding to these challenges. Simultaneously, international organizations, stakeholders and interest groups offer different solutions and pose different future narratives for how to handle these challenges. Within this context, national curricula and support structures are seen as devices that can govern education in appropriate ways.

The PhD position is expected to contribute to a critical understanding of how national curriculum policies respond to democratic challenges promoted by global or local organizations or how schools and professions work to develop democratic, sustainable and inclusive practices in their daily school life.

The project could compare Norwegian curricula with other countries' curricula with a particular interest in subject-specific or cross-disciplinary topics or the applicant can also zoom in on particular issues regarding national education politics and/ or programmatic work of professionals in schools and the surrounding society. A contemporary curriculum history approach to sustainability and democracy is also welcome.

It is expected that the announced PhD position will be connected to the research group Curriculum Studies, Leadership and Educational governance (CLEG). More information about the research group can be found on the group's website.

More about the position

The fellowship period is up to 4 years, with 3 years devoted to research education. The position entails a compulsory workload of 25%, that consists of teaching and supervision duties and research assistance.

The research fellow must take part in the faculty's approved PhD program and is expected to complete the project within the set fellowship period. The main purpose of the fellowship is research training leading to the successful completion of a PhD degree

Qualification requirements

Applicants must satisfy the requirements for admission to the faculty's PhD programme. This normally includes:

- Applicants must hold a master's degree or equivalent in pedagogy, education or other relevant discipline in social sciences (e.g. law, sociology, political science).
- A Master's degree (120 ECTS) with a minimum grade B (ECTS grading scale) or equivalent. The master's degree must include a thesis of at least 30 ECTS, with a minimum grade B.
- Fluent oral and written communication skills in English and Norwegian (or another Scandinavian language)

In the assessment of applications, emphasis will be placed on:

 The quality of the project description, the description of the research topic's relevance to educational issues, the specific problems to be studied, the choice of scientific theory and method, and the proposed implementation plan for the study

- The applicant's experience, personal suitability and motivation for the post, including the ability to collaborate and to form part of a crossdisciplinary academic community
- The applicant's academic attitude and motivation regarding completing the research training program

We offer

- List of reference persons: 2-3 references (name, relation to candidate, e-mail, and phone number)
