PHD Position in Ethics, Environmental Philosophy and Ecotheology

About the position

The Faculty of Theology, University of Oslo, has a free position as PhD fellow within ethics, environmental philosophy, and eco-theology. The position is advertised as part of the <u>UiO:Democracy</u> project <u>DEMOCRISIS: Democracy</u> and <u>Climate Crisis</u>. DEMOCRISIS will analyse the climate crisis from different disciplinary and inter-disciplinary perspectives and inquire whether climate tipping points leads to a crisis for democracy.

The successful candidate will do research on ethics, democracy, and ecology within the overall project. We expect the ability to provide advanced discussions of contemporary and classical problems within ethics, environmental philosophy, philosophy of religion and/or ecotheology in dialogue with adjacent fields such as biology, life science, philosophy, psychology, and anthropology. The applicant's project proposal should relate to one or more Work Packages in the overall research plan, such as WP1 (Tipping points), WP2 (Democracy and long-term thinking), WP3 (Democracy and Degrowth), WP4 (Civil Disobedience) or WP5 (values and knowledge regimes). Interdisciplinary perspectives are welcome, and the successful candidate could also get supervision for researchers at other faculties. The PhD Fellow will be a member of the Research Group for Systematic theology and the Research Group DEMOCRISIS.

The appointment is for a duration of 3 years. All PhD Candidates who submit their doctoral dissertation for assessment with a written recommendation from their supervisor within 3 years or 3 ½ years after the start of their PhD position, will be offered, respectively, a 12 or 6 month Completion Grant.

The research fellow must take part in the Faculty of Theology's approved PhD program and the candidate is expected to complete the project within the set fellowship period. The main purpose of the fellowship is research training leading to the successful completion of a PhD degree. It is expected that he PhD candidate is active in the research environment at the faculty and contributes to its development. Learn more about the doctoral education.

The position is a full-time position starting on October 1, 2024. It is expected that the person who receives the position is physically based in Oslo during the period of employment, except for a possible exchange period to another educational institution, if such an opportunity arises. The PhD candidate is also expected to work closely with the research team and to represent the project at relevant seminars and conferences.

Qualification requirements

Cand.theol. degree or equivalent master's degree in a field relevant to the project. The degree must have been obtained at the time of application. Personal suitability and motivation for the position are also considered.

The following will also be emphasized in the assessment of applicants:

- The quality of the project description, research relevance, and innovation potential.
- Academic and personal ability to complete the project within the given time frame.
- Good collaborative skills and willingness and ability to participate in interdisciplinary collaboration at the University of Oslo and internationally.
- · Good proficiency in written and spoken English and a Scandinavian language

Applicants who have recently completed examinations with excellent results may be preferred.

How to apply

The application must include:

- Application letter describing the applicant's qualifications and motivation for the position.
- Curriculum Vitae (with a list of education, positions, teaching experience, administrative experience, and other qualifying activities, as well as published and unpublished works).
- Project description, including a progress plan for the project (up to five pages).
- Transcripts or diplomas for bachelor's and master's degrees. Applicants with education from a foreign university should include a guide
 to the grading system at their university.
- Reference list (2-3 references; name, title, email, and telephone, as well as a description of the relationship to the applicant. At least one
 of the references should be a current or former manager with personnel responsibility).
- Any documentation of language requirements, see <u>Language requirements</u>.

Please note that all documents must be in English or a Scandinavian language.

Applications with attachments must be submitted through our online recruitment system, please click "Apply for the position".

Interviews will be conducted as part of the selection process.

Formal regulations
