PhD Research Fellowship in English linguistics

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PhD position

The Department of Foreign Languages invites applications for a PhD position in English linguistics commencing from August 2025, or as agreed upon. The position is for a fixed-term period of four years.

The Department of Foreign Languages spans nine different languages: Arabic, Chinese, English, French, German, Italian, Japanese, Russian and Spanish language and Latin-American Studies. Teaching and research are conducted in the disciplines of language/linguistics, literature, history/cultural studies and didactics (http://www.uib.no/en/fremmedsprak). The Department has around 60 permanent academic staff members, along with approximately 20 PhD and postdoctoral fellows, and eleven administrative members of staff.

The PhD candidate will be affiliated with the section for English linguistics at the Department of Foreign Languages, as well as with the research group Language Data and Language Change (LDLC), based at the same Department. The PhD project must be compatible with the research interests of the members of the section for English linguistics, and it must also be relevant to the LDLC research group in the area of English linguistics. Potential fields of research include, but are not strictly limited to:

- Language variation and change on all levels of linguistic analysis (phonetics/ phonology, morphology, syntax, semantics)
- · Synchronic or historical linguistics
- Corpus linguistics
- Language contact
- Contrastive linguistics

The PhD project must emphasize the use of empirical data, and its argumentation should be quantitatively oriented. The project should be anchored in and/or informed by linguistic theory.

About the PhD position and the research training

The main purpose of the PhD position is to complete a doctoral degree, which qualifies for independent research and other forms of employment that demand specific competency.

The duration of the PhD position is four years. The time allocated to the research project itself is 2.5 years, whilst a total of one year will be devoted to other, career-promoting work such as teaching, dissemination of results and university administration. A plan for this part of the position will be established in collaboration with the Department. The remaining six months will be allocated to formal training. As a PhD candidate, you must participate in the Faculty of Humanities ph.d program. The PhD programme comprises a training component corresponding to 30 ECTS.

Qualifications and personal qualities

- The applicant must hold a Norwegian master's degree or an equivalent foreign degree in English linguistics. It is a condition of employment that the master's degree has been awarded by the application deadline. Foreign degrees will be evaluated according to the regulations of the Norwegian Directorate for Higher Education an Skillsand The Faculty of Humanities' PhD Programme plan.
- The applicants must be able to work independently in a structured manner and have strong cooperation skills.
- · Applicants must be fluent in both written and oral English.
- Documented skills in the use of modern corpus tools will be an advantage.
- Experience with dissemination work will be an advantage.

Applicants must submit a proposal for a research project that will result in a doctoral dissertation, as well as a progress plan for the project.

In assessing the applications, the academic quality and feasibility of the proposed PhD project and the academic qualifications of the candidate will be considered. Further emphasis is placed on strategic considerations, motivation, and the applicant's personal eligibility.

- Applicants must submit a draft proposal for a research project, within the field of English linguistics, that will result in a doctoral
 dissertation, as well as a progress plan for the project. The project proposal should comprise up to five pages/12.000 characters
 including spaces (however, the list of references does not contribute to the wordcount). The project proposal should describe the
 research project, including research background, main research questions, theory, method, etc. The proposal must also clearly show
 how the PhD project fits into the section for English linguistics, as well as the LDLC research group, at the Department of Foreign
 Languages.
- Bibliography for the proposed project.
- A progress plan for the whole duration of the project, including time for the career-promoting work and obligatory training component.
- A brief account of the applicant's research interests and motivation for applying for the position.
- CV
- Transcripts and diplomas showing completion of the bachelor's and master's degrees. This must contain information about the number
 of ECTS of the master's degree or be followed by an official and personalized confirmation with this information issued by the awarding
 institution.
- A short summary of the master's thesis or equivalent thesis (up to three pages).
- A list of any works of a scientific nature (publication list).
- Publications in your name (up to three works).
- Relevant certificates/references.
- The names and contact information for two referees. One of these must be the main supervisor for the master's thesis or equivalent thesis.

The application and attachments must be in Norwegian, another Scandinavian language or English. Documents in other languages must be accompanied by certified translations into English or a Scandinavian language. Please ensure that all attachments are in either Word or PDF format and are uploaded to Jobbnorge within the application deadline.

The Committee of Experts may occasionally request additional documentation be submitted.

Shortlisted candidates will be called in to an interview.
