Postdoctoral Research Fellow - extended deadline

The Centre for Climate and Energy Transformation (CET) at the University of Bergen is currently expanding. We are now recruiting a postdoctoral research fellow to strengthen the centre's key research areas. CET aims to develop actionable knowledge about societal transformation pathways - strategies for society to decarbonize its energy supply, bring the economy into line with climate and ecological boundaries, and build resilience to changing climates. With a basis in social science, we bring together researchers across disciplinary boundaries in collaboration and knowledge exchange.

We are currently seeking a postdoctoral research fellow for a period of three years to work within one of the five prioritized research areas for CET:

- Analysis of policy and market dynamics
- Integrated modelling of societal transformation pathways
- Public perceptions and preferences
- Urban and local governance
- National-level energy transitions

The researcher will have workplace at the CET floor of the Faculty of Social Sciences building, and will be expected to contribute to making CET a dynamic and productive academic environment.

The position is not limited to specific disciplines. However, the applicants' competence, as well as the proposed research, must be relevant to the scope of CET's prioritized research areas.

Qualifications and personal qualities:

- The applicant must hold a Norwegian PhD or an equivalent degree within the fields of climate, energy, transformation, environment, sustainability or social change, or must have submitted his/her doctoral thesis for assessment prior to the application deadline. It is a condition of employment that the PhD has been awarded.
- An interest in interdisciplinary research, and a demonstrated ability to work with others
- Experience with academic publication. We expect a significant record of international publications.
- Proficiency in both written and oral English

If possible, applicants should have discussed their project with a prospective mentor at the University of Bergen or otherwise connected to CET. Please indicate in the application whether a mentor has been identified. This is not a prerequisite, but we need to assess the centre's ability to provide a stimulating academic environment for the postdoctoral research fellow.

Potential candidates will be invited to the department for an interview, and might be asked to hold a trial lecture in a given topic.

The final ranking of applicants may take into consideration the overall balance of CET researchers across disciplines and research areas.

About the position of postdoctoral research fellow:

The position of postdoctoral research fellow is a fixed-term appointment with the primary objective of qualifying the appointee for work in top academic positions. The fixed-term period for this position is three years. Individuals may not be hired for more than one fixed-term period as a postdoctoral research fellow at the same institution.

It is a requirement that the project can be completed in the course of the period of employment.

We can offer:

- A good and professionally challenging working environment.
- Salary at pay grade 57-60 (code 1352) on the government salary scale upon appointment (equivalent to NOK 490 900 - 517 700,- per year). Further promotions are made according to length of service in the position.
- Enrolment in the Norwegian Public Service Pension Fund.
- A position in an inclusive workplace (IW).
- Good welfare benefits.

Your application must include:

- A brief account of the applicant's research interests and motivation for applying for the position.

- A project proposal (6-8 pages) explaining the intended theoretical and/or empirical contributions of the project, as well as methodological foundations and plans for data collection. Applicants should include a plan for dissemination (academic and non-academic). The proposal should also include a budget for data collection or fieldwork.
- The names and contact information for two reference persons. One of these must be the main advisor from the PhD programme.
- CV, including list of publications.
- Transcripts and diplomas and official confirmation that the doctoral thesis has been submitted.
- Relevant certificates/references.
- Up to five scientific publications.

The application and appendices with certified translations into English or a Scandinavian language must be uploaded at Jobbnorge.
