Paintings conservator

At the University Museum in Bergen, Department for Collection Management, there is a vacancy for a paintings conservator in a 2-year project position. The position may be extended. The Department of Collection Management has 27 employees and is responsible for the management, preservation, conservation, and documentation of the museum's collections and archives for research and dissemination purposes. The advertised position is linked to work with the upcoming restoration of the Museum of Cultural History and the University project Secure Collections; an ongoing project to improve the storage conditions of the museum's cultural and historical collections.

It is desirable that this vacancy is filled as soon as possible.

Work assignments:

The work tasks will involve in-situ treatment, packing, and moving the museum's unique collection of painted church art from the Middle Ages and post-Reformation period. We seek a conservator with broad experience in the conservation of painted church art, both on wood and canvas, who can carry out work of high quality following professional ethical standards. The work will at times be physically demanding. The appointed person must be able to work independently and as part of a team and contribute to the professional development and implementation of the project.

Qualifications and personal attributes:

The applicant must have:

- Approved 2-year master's degree or equivalent in paintings conservation. A bachelor's degree combined with relevant experience can replace the requirement for a master's degree
- Minimum of two years' experience with stabilizing and conserving painted church art from the Middle Ages
- Good general IT competence
- Good written and oral presentation skills in a Scandinavian language (Norwegian, Swedish or Danish) and/or English

It is an advantage to have:

- Experience with conservation of distemper painting
- · Experience with in-situ treatment of church art
- · Experience of working on scaffolding.
- Knowledge and understanding of systematic HSE-work
- Driver's license (class B)
